Description of Work

Paint stripe City of Omak streets per the attached Exhibit A and the MUTCD.

This Agreement is entered into by and between the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) and the above named governmental agency (Agency), hereinafter referred to individually as the "Party" and collectively as the "Parties."

#### Recital

1. The Agency has requested and WSDOT has agreed to perform certain work as described above.

Now Therefore, pursuant to chapter 39.34 RCW.

It Is Hereby Agreed As Follows:

#### 1. General

- 1.1 WSDOT agrees to perform the above described work, using state labor, equipment and materials, as requested by the Agency.
- 1.2 The Agency agrees, in consideration of the faithful performance of the above described work to be done by WSDOT, to reimburse WSDOT for the actual direct and related indirect costs of the work. Administrative Charges at current rate are considered part of indirect costs.

#### 2. Payment

- 2.1 The estimated cost of the work is stated above. The Agency agrees to set aside funds for payment to WSDOT in this amount.
- 2.2 The Agency agrees to pay WSDOT for the work done within thirty (30) days from receipt of a WSDOT invoice, which shall include documentation supporting the work done.
- 2.3 If the Agency is a county or city, the Agency agrees that if it does not make payment as provided under the terms of this Agreement, the Agency authorizes WSDOT to withhold and use as payment Motor Vehicle Fund monies credited or to be credited to the Agency.

2.4 The Agency agrees further that if payment is not made to WSDOT within thirty (30) days from receipt of WSDOT's invoice, WSDOT may charge late fees and/or interest in accordance with Washington State Law.

#### 3. Increase in Cost

The Parties agree that the estimated cost of the work may be exceeded by up to 25%. In the event of such increased costs the Parties agree to modify the estimated cost of work by written amendment, signed by both Parties. WSDOT shall notify the Agency of increased costs as they become known.

#### 4. Right of Entry

The Agency grants to WSDOT a right of entry upon all land in which the Agency has interest for the purpose of accomplishing the work described above.

#### 5. Claims

Claims for Damages: After completion of work by WSDOT, in the event of claims for damages or loss attributable to bodily injury, sickness, death, or injury to or destruction of property that occurs within the limits of the work performed by WSDOT for the Agency, the Agency shall defend such claims and hold harmless the WSDOT therefrom, and WSDOT shall not be obligated to pay any claim, judgement or cost of defense. Nothing in this Section, however, shall remove from WSDOT any responsibility defined by the current laws of the state of Washington or from any liability for damages caused by WSDOT's own negligent acts or omissions independent of the work performed pursuant to this Agreement.

#### 6. Indemnification

The Agency shall defend, protect and hold harmless WSDOT, its officials, employees, and/or agents from and against all claims, suits or actions arising from the negligent acts or omissions of Agency, its officers, officials, employees, assigns, contractors, sub-contractors, tenants, sub-tenants, licensees, invitees and/or agents while performing work under the terms of this Agreement. This defense and indemnity obligation shall not include such claims, actions, costs, damages, or expenses which may be caused by the sole negligence of WSDOT, its officers, officials, employees, contractors, sub-contractors and/or agents; provided, however, that if the claims, suits or actions are caused by or result from the concurrent negligence of (a) WSDOT, its officers, officials, agents, contractors, sub-contractors or employees and (b) the Agency, its officers, officials, employees, assigns, contractors, sub-contractors, tenants, sub-tenants, licensees, invitees and/or agents, or involves those actions covered by RCW 4.24.115, this indemnity provision shall be valid and enforceable only to the extent of the negligence of the Agency or its officers, officials, employees, assigns, contractors, sub-contractors, tenants, sub-tenants, licensees, invitees and/or agents. Agency specifically assumes potential liability for the actions brought by Agency's employees and solely for the purposes of this indemnification and defense, Agency specifically waives any immunity it may be afforded in connection with such claims under the State industrial insurance law, Title 51 RCW. Agency recognizes that this waiver was the subject of mutual negotiations.

This indemnification and waiver shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

#### 7. Modification

This Agreement may be amended by the mutual agreement of the Parties. Such amendments or modification shall not be binding unless they are in writing and signed by persons authorized to bind each Party.

## 8. Termination Clause (Check the Appropriate Box Below)

8.1	This Agreement will automatically terminate five (5) years after date of execution. This Agreement
may be to	erminated by either Party upon thirty (30) days advanced written notice to the other Party. In the event
of termina	ation, payment will be made by the Agency for work completed by WSDOT as of the effective date
of termina	ation.

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
#### 9. Disputes and Venue

In the event that a dispute arises under this Agreement, it shall be resolved as follows: WSDOT's Secretary of Transportation or designee and the Agency's head or designee shall review the applicable facts, contract terms, statutes and rules affecting the dispute to resolve the matter. If the parties cannot reach a resolution, the Parties agree that any legal action to enforce any right or obligation under this Agreement may only be brought in Spokane

County Superior Court. The venue specified in this section shall not apply to any federal agency that is a Party to this Agreement.

The Attached Resolution 39-2022 A Resolution Approving Supplement No. 4 Between the City of Omak and Washington State Department of Transportation for the Engh Road/SR215 Improvements ROW, is forwarded for your consideration.

We have now received bids on the Engh project and are prepared to award project. This project has been fraught with delays. The total cost of the project is now estimated to exceed the Federal Award by \$259,025

We have requested \$224,056 (86.5%) in additional funds from the County's allocation of the Federal Highway funds and will apply to TIB for the remaining \$34,968 (13.5%.) Neither of these sources are guaranteed. But it is unlikely that we will be denied through the County's process.

In the event we are denied by either agency the city is on the hook for any additional costs the project incurs beyond the currently obligated amounts. This project has been on the books Since 2014 and was expected to exceed the original budget.

This project needs to move forward quickly to ensure it can be completed within the opportunity of the temporary construction easements and the availability of HMA. Even if the additional funding is not successful, it is my recommendation that we move forward with this project and fund the match dollars from current reserves.

I have included the best- and worst-case scenarios to the resolution. Final approval of additional funding may not be known until next week. I am seeking approval for the WSDOT approved Supplement #4 that identifies the least local agency match.

I approve this Resolution and urge it Adoption

#### VI. Payment and Partial Reimbursement

The total cost of the project, including all review and engineering costs and other expenses of the State, is to be paid by the Agency and by the Federal Government. Federal funding shall be in accordance with the Federal Transportation Act, as amended, 2 CFR Part 200. The State shall not be ultimately responsible for any of the costs of the project. The Agency shall be ultimately responsible for all costs associated with the project which are not reimbursed by the Federal Government. Nothing in this agreement shall be construed as a promise by the State as to the amount or nature of federal participation in this project.

The Agency shall bill the state for federal aid project costs incurred in conformity with applicable federal and state laws. The agency shall minimize the time elapsed between receipt of federal aid funds and subsequent payment of incurred costs. Expenditures by the Local Agency for maintenance, general administration, supervision, and other overhead shall not be eligible for federal participation unless a current indirect cost plan has been prepared in accordance with the regulations outlined in 2 CFR Part 200 - Uniform Admin. Requirements, Cost Principles and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards, and retained for audit.

The State will pay for State incurred costs on the project. Following payment, the State shall bill the Federal Government for reimbursement of those costs eligible for federal participation to the extent that such costs are attributable and properly allocable to this project. The State shall bill the Agency for that portion of State costs which were not reimbursed by the Federal Government (see Section IX).

#### VII. Audit of Federal Consultant Contracts

The Agency, if services of a consultant are required, shall be responsible for audit of the consultant's records to determine eligible federal aid costs on the project. The report of said audit shall be in the Agency's files and made available to the State and the Federal Government.

An audit shall be conducted by the WSDOT Internal Audit Office in accordance with generally accepted governmental auditing standards as issued by the United States General Accounting Office by the Comptroller General of the United States; WSDOT Manual M 27-50, Consultant Authorization, Selection, and Agreement Administration; memoranda of understanding between WSDOT and FHWA; and 2 CFR Part 200.501 - Audit Requirements.

If upon audit it is found that overpayment or participation of federal money in ineligible items of cost has occurred, the Agency shall reimburse the State for the amount of such overpayment or excess participation.

#### IX. Payment of Billing

The Agency agrees that if payment or arrangement for payment of any of the State's billing relative to the project (e.g., State force work, project cancellation, overpayment, cost ineligible for federal participation, etc.) is not made to the State within 45 days after the Agency has been billed, the State shall effect reimbursement of the total sum due from the regular monthly fuel tax allotments to the Agency from the Motor Vehicle Fund. No additional Federal project funding will be approved until full payment is received unless otherwise directed by the Director, Local Programs.

Project Agreement End Date - This date is based on your projects Period of Performance (2 CFR Part 200.309). Any costs incurred after the Project Agreement End Date are NOT eligible for federal reimbursement. All eligible costs incurred prior to the Project Agreement End Date must be submitted for reimbursement within 90 days after the Project Agreement End Date or they become ineligible for federal reimbursement.

#### VIII. Single Audit Act

The Agency, as a subrecipient of federal funds, shall adhere to the federal regulations outlined in 2 CFR Part 200.501 as well as all applicable federal and state statutes and regulations. # CITY OF OMAK ENGH ROAD – SR215/US 97 INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENTS SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENT 7

#### INTRODUCTION

This scope amends the Scope of Work approved by the City of Omak on August 5, 2015.

The Consultant shall perform those tasks as listed herein to assist the City during the construction phase of the project, to include coordination with regulatory and funding agencies, adjacent property owners, utility companies, and the Contractor.

#### **CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT SERVICES**

It is the intent of this scope to provide sufficient services for the duration of the contract (60 working days).

#### <u>Task No.</u> <u>Task</u>

- 1. Project Management Provide overall project management to include resource allocation management, client contact, and coordination with various project stakeholders including, but not limited to, WSDOT Local Programs, City, Contractor, CA Agency (WSDOT), abutting property owners (as needed), utility companies, and regulatory agencies during the construction phase of project.
- 2. Preconstruction Services
  - A. Assist the City in contract execution (Contractor and City).
  - B. Organize and lead the preconstruction conference (prepare agenda in accordance with appendix 52.101 of the LAG Manual, send out invitations, conduct meeting, and prepare/distribute meeting minutes) in accordance with appendix 52.102 of the LAG Manual, and issuing a formal Notice to Proceed. Coordinate with WSDOT Local Programs.
  - C. Review Contractor's schedule, and provide comments to Contractor and Agency as applicable.

#### 3. Contract Administration

- A. Assist the City with preparation of reimbursement requests to WSDOT.
- B. Provide submittal/RAM/QPL review; update and manage the Record of Materials (ROM) with submittal information; and material testing information, evaluate Contractor's Schedule of Values for lump sum items and verify allocations are made in accordance with the requirements of the Contract Documents. Review/track traffic control files.
- C. Track, review and evaluate Request for Information from Contractor. Manage responses to RFIs.
- D. Prime/Subcontractor tracking: review of requests to sublet, statement of intent to pay prevailing wages, certified payroll report; complete wage rate interviews, submit PR1391 and PR1392 forms to WSDOT if applicable, in accordance with Section 1-08.1.
- E. DBE Tracking: confirm DBE meets contract requirements, conduct commercially useful function surveys, track/submit monthly DBE report to WSDOT in accordance with Section 1-08.1, to confirm goal is met. Review Contractor submitted information through the DMCS system. Conduct on-site interviews as necessary.
- F. Prepare monthly progress (pay) estimates and review with Contractor and City. Prepare WSDOT backup for quantities paid each month. Assist City with WSDOT project billing forms.
- G. Prepare up to two change orders. Represent the City's interest in negotiation of change order with the Contractor. Provide independent estimate and record quantity measurements of material, equipment and manpower for determining costs for change orders. Coordinate with WSDOT to obtain Blue Book rates on equipment as may be applicable. Prepare change orders for execution by the City and Contractor subject to approval of the City, CA Agency (WSDOT). This task does not include any work for new or additional design tasks nor additional survey work as may be related thereto depending on the nature of the change order(s).
- H. Conduct construction meetings with the Project Manager, the Contractor, City's representative, various regulatory or funding

personnel, utility companies, and other stakeholders deemed necessary to help facilitate construction and construction coordination. Note: this item assumes 2 meetings/site visits by the Project Manager.

- I. At substantial completion, coordinate with the City, Local Programs (WSDOT) in accordance with chapter 52.81 of the LAG Manual, and resident inspector, and prepare a punchlist of items to be completed or corrected.
- J. Coordinate final walk-thru of the project with the City, Contractor, inspector, WSDOT, and Project Manager prior to recommending project acceptance.
- K. Provide copies of all project paperwork to the City and WSDOT.

#### 4. Field Inspection

A. Provide part-time on-site observation services (up to 440 hours over the course of 60 days) to observe the progress of the work and determine, in general, that the work is proceeding in accordance with the Contract Documents and notify Contractor of non-compliance. Review means and methods employed by Contractor and materials delivered to the site. Provide field documentation to include: Inspector's Daily Report, field note records, Weekly Quantity Reports, Weekly Working Day Reports, and Daily Report of Force Account Worked, wage rate interviews, DBE Commercially Useful Function Reports and other pertinent documentation. Confirm quantities for payment with Contractor in the field.

#### 5. Survey Staking

- A. Provide control points as shown in the Plans to allow for construction staking.
- B. Provide one-time construction staking for:
  - 1. Clearing limits;
  - 2. Sawcut locations;
  - 3. Storm drainage and piping;

- 4. Top back of curb (or other curb location as requested by the contractor)
- 6. Material Testing (Subconsultant)
  - A. Coordinate and provide material and compaction testing.
  - B. Review material testing results and arrange for additional testing as needed.
- 7. Project Closeout Services
  - A. Assist the City in closing out the project, prepare notice of completion form, project voucher, including WSDOT Local Programs final audit, in compliance with State and Federal law.
  - B. Prepare and sign materials certification form.
  - C. Provide project files to the City and WSDOT if requested.


