RENEW THE INTER-GOVERNMENTAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT WITH THE CONFEDERATED TRIBES OF THE COLVILLE RESERVATION TO DESIGNATE EASTSIDE PARK FOR FIREWORKS DISCHARGE

WHEREAS, the City and the Confederated Tribes of the Colville Reservation have had an Inter-Governmental Cooperation Agreement for designating Eastside Park in Omak as a place for fireworks discharge for the past two years; and

WHEREAS, the use of Eastside Park provides a designated area for discharge in celebration of the Fourth of July, and eliminates most of the dispersed discharge of fireworks throughout the Omak area, thereby reducing fire risk; and

WHEREAS, the agreement and the assistance with the clean-up of Eastside Park has been a great success from the standpoint of the Public Works Department; and

WHEREAS, designation of Eastside Park provides a place where the danger of wildfire is significantly less than the previous designated location at Omak Lake; and

WHEREAS, discharge of fireworks in Eastside Parks results in a concentration of fireworks debris that is much easier to clean up, and prevents additional fireworks debris from collecting in Omak Lake.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Omak that the <u>Inter-Governmental Cooperation Agreement: Facilities Agreement for Designation of Eastside Park for Fireworks Discharge</u> is hereby renewed for 2014 in accordance with the provisions of Section 6 of said agreement.

- 2. The Tribes agrees to provide fire patrols in the vicinity of the park, to insure that all fireworks discharging is confined to the designated area within the park, and during the authorized time between noon and midnight on July 4th.
- 3. The City agrees to provide fire patrols in the vicinity of the park to insure that all fireworks discharging is confined to the designated areas within the park and during the authorized time between noon and midnight on July 4th.
- 4. The Tribes and the City agree to jointly work to remove all fireworks debris and trash from Eastside Park and return the park to a clean and inviting condition for the public the day following the authorized day for discharge. It is agreed that the two entities will share the clean-up burden equally. The City's representative for supervision of clean-up operations shall be the Public Works Director whose phone number is (509) 846-9157. The Tribes representative for supervision of clean-up operations shall be Ms. Pete Palmer, available at 509-322-3184 or 509-634-2577.
- 5. The Tribes agree to hold and save harmless the City from all loss, damage, liability or expense, including expense of litigation resulting from any actual or alleged injury to any person or from any actual or alleged loss of or damage to any property caused by or resulting from any act or omission of Tribes, including its officers, agents, employees, guests, invitees and/or visitors. The City likewise agrees to hold the Tribes harmless from all loss, damage, liability or expense, including expense of litigation resulting from any actual or alleged injury to any person or from any actual or alleged loss of or damage to any property caused by or resulting from any act or omission of the City, including its officers, agents, employees, guests, invitees and/or visitors. Nothing herein may be construed as a waiver, limited or otherwise, of the Colville Tribes' inherent sovereign immunity.

6. This agreement is for the 2013 Fourth of July Celebration only, but can be renewed by mutual written consent of the parties if the Memorandum of Agreement continues to be in the best interest of both parties.

This Agreement shall be in full force and effect and binding upon its execution.
