THIS AMENDMENT TO AN INTERLOCAL COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT REGARDING RCW 82.14.370 "PUBLIC FACILITIES" is entered into this , 2004, between the City of Omak, Washington (the "Local City"), and Okanogan County, Washington (the "County"). WHEREAS, the County entered into an Interlocal Cooperative agreement with the Local City November 4, 2003, for financial assistance from the County in the amount of \$50,000 to finance the acquisition, construction, installation and/or equipping of a new Restroom/Shower Facility in the Carl Precht RV Park, which facilities will be owned by the Local City; WHEREAS, the Local City and the County, by their respective governing bodies, have determined that it is in the best interest of each jurisdiction to increase the appropriation for this project due to the fact that the single bid received for the project is \$50,000 more than expected as explained in attachment A; WHEREAS, time is of the essence in that construction must start soon in order for the project to be completed prior to the 2005 tourist season; WHEREAS, the Local City is authorized by State law to undertake the Project, and the County is authorized by RCW 82.14.370 to finance the Project; and NOW, THEREFORE, the Local City and the County agree to amend the Interlocal Cooperative Agreement entered into November 4, 2004, as follows: The County will transfer an additional \$50,000 (the 'Grant Amount") to the Local City to finance the additional costs of the Project. COUNTY FACILITIES FUND APPLICATION QUESTIONS

City of Omak: Precht RV Park Restroom/Shower Facility Supplemental Request

Applicants (see Attachment C for list of eligible public agencies) applying for Public Facilities fund dollars must provide responses to the following questions in addition to completing the on-line WA-CERT application:

1. Provide a description of how the project is consistent with the requirements of RCW 82.14.370 (see attachment B) including what short and long-term economic development needs or opportunities will be addressed or barriers removed.

RCW 82.14.370 requires that projects funded with .08% sales tax rebate dollars be public facilities that enhance economic development in rural counties. The project, entailing replacement of the restroom/shower facility in the Carl Precht RV Park, will improve the amenities and increase capacity in the City's Eastside Park, the site of Okanogan County's largest single tourism draw – the Omak Stampede.

 Provide a project budget that shows current and proposed funding that clearly illustrates the total funding required for the project from the Public Facilities fund. Also specify which account: Emerging Opportunities, City and Town Facilities or County Facilities from which funding is requested.

The City is pursuing \$50,000 from the Emerging Opportunities Account in order to obtain the funding required to complete the project. The City received approval of a \$50,000 City and Town Facilities Account grant in the fall of 2003, has secured a \$120,000 loan (repaid from Current Expense) and budgeted \$75,000 from park reserves and hotel/motel funds to come up with the \$240,000 estimated for project. Design, permitting, and environmental review have been completed. With funding and permits in hand the City proceeded to advertise for bids. The first attempt attracted no bidders. The City re-advertised and received one bid, from a local contractor, on September 8th. The sole bid was submitted in the amount of \$293,970.73.

In order to complete the project and replace the existing facility the City desires to accept the bid and get the project underway. The critical need for the project was highlighted during this year's Omak Stampede, Suicide Race and Indian Encampment when the condition of the facility generated many complaints and maintenance problems for the City. As the central facility serving the popular Carl Precht RV Park, an important visitor attraction, it is imperative the project be completed prior to Spring 2005.
